Local Nonprofits Awarded Funding

A subcommittee (comprised of City Councilors) reviewed this years funding requests from various organizations. September was National Preparedness Month and on Thursday, October 18th at 10:18 am The Great Oregon Shakeout will take place. The Great Oregon Shakeout is a chance to practice for an earthquake. It is a great opportunity to give your emergency plan a test run, check your emergency go and stay kits, review communication plans and if you haven't already sign up for emergency notifications and community information through *Lincoln Alerts*. Residential and landline numbers are automatically included in the emergency contact list and do not require any action from you. To register your mobile phone and email go to www.co.lincoln.or.us/alerts. The webpage guides you through the registration process and includes helpful tips. Being prepared for an emergency is the first step in recovering from one. Please sign up for alerts and use this time to talk with your loved ones about preparedness.
